Section 1: Socio-dramatic Area

Option 1:

- Role Play: Children go into role acting out various scenarios and roles inside a teacher-constructed area. Scenarios can include:
- Census Taking: One child is inside the home and the other is the 'census taker' holding a clip board and a questionnaire (Teacher input may be required here – prepare questions for the children to ask).
- Life in the Olden Days: Using data from <u>previous censuses</u> discuss what life was like in the olden days (no TV, phones, cars etc). Children act out how they believe life to have been.

Option 2:

• Games with Rules: children play with and explore a selection of puzzles, mini games, and board games that focus on the theme of working and living in a house and a home.

Section 2: Small World

Option 1:

- Build a house
- Build a village

The Census Taker comes to the village/house to deliver and collect the census forms.

- What do they think the area needs?
- What else can they add to make the village more useful/appealing?

Option 2:

Using a doll's house, mini furniture and mini figurines the children can act out the Census Taker coming to the door and showing what and who is in their home.

Section 3: Art Area/Fine Motor Skills

Option 1:

Build houses out of 'Junk Art' using recyclable materials e.g., houses made out of shoe boxes, milk cartons, toilet rolls, cardboard, flowerpots etc. Use the skills of draw, cutting and pasting where necessary.

Option 2:

Clay houses

Option 3:

Drawing/painting myself, my family and my home.

Option 4:

Fabric and Fibre: use various materials create items that will decorate the home, such as: carpet, blankets, curtains etc.

Section 4: Construction Area

Construction Site:

Design, plan and build homes using a variety of materials, such as:

- Lego
- Wooden building blocks
- Cardboard
- Matchsticks

Section 5: Wet/dry Area Area

Children can be given the task of finding mini house/home related items in the sand, e.g. a bed, a television, and must classify and sort the item into piles based on their location in the house, i.e. all kitchen furniture and utensils must be sorted into one pile.

Materials:

- Sand
- Rice
- Water
- Mud






